TEACHING *(since Sept 2023)*

(TEXT)ILE ARCHITECTURES (proposal)

How do we inhabit narratives? This interdisciplinary week-long intensive, co-taught with Chilean textile artist Amanda Goicovic, invites art students to translate sensory experience into narrative space by exploring the historical connection between text and textiles through a blend of theory, textile crafts, and experimental writing.

CREATIVE WRITING (EFAP 2nd year, WRITING AND RHETORIC ISCOM 1st year)

This workshop is designed to improve students' linguistic sensitivity through a (re)discovery of the pleasure of writing. We experiment with ekphrastic writing, collaborative world-building, and Oulipian constraint-based exercises to hone our skills of observation and narrative construction. Students develop a critical eye for the effective use of stylistic devices in various rhetorical situations, culminating in an individual or small-group print publication.

SEMIOLOGY (ecv 4th year, 5th year, ISCOM 3rd year)

Alternating between theory and hands-on analysis, this course introduces design and communication students to the fundamentals of semiology as a "toolkit" for deepening their understanding of the life of signs in society. Students practice semiotic analysis using examples in contemporary life, advertising campaigns, and visual art, sharpening their critical thinking about the manipulation and interpretation of signs.

RHETORICAL PRESENTATIONS (EFAP 4th year, ENGLISH TALK ISTC 3rd year, PITCHING ISCOM 3rd year)

The objective of this module is to guide students in defending a thoughtful critique within their professional field. Through the analysis of effective arguments and collaborative work to develop their personal opinions, students learn to structure an argument, create compelling visuals, and deliver a persuasive speech.

THESIS DEFENSE COACHING (ISD Rubika 5th year)

One-on-one coaching sessions with graduating designers to develop their storytelling and presentation skills, including work on narrative structure, body language, and strategies for a smooth Q&A with a panel of professionals.

PRESS REVIEW (ISTC 2nd year)

This media literacy course is designed to help students broaden their perspectives and develop critical thinking about international news. Students deepen their understanding of the world and the contemporary media landscape by identifying different forms of bias and asking informed questions about news stories and sources.

BUSINESS COMMUNICATION (EDHEC Pre-Master's Grande Ecole Program and Business Law Management cohort)

In this course, students improve their written and oral English communication skills through case studies and role-plays. Modules include pitching, interviewing, holding effective meetings, crisis management, and negotiation.
